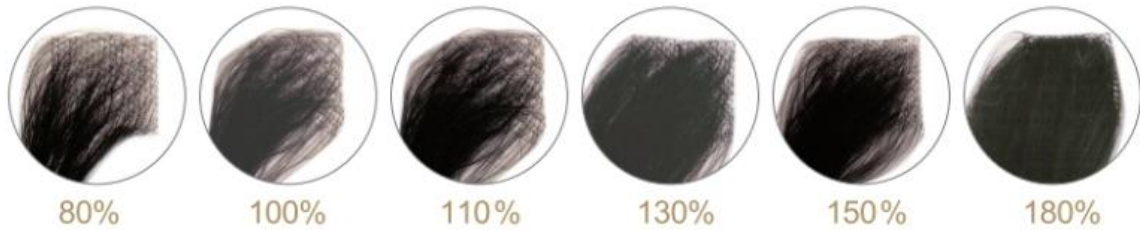


5. Ventilating
